

The victims state that James Hughes was in the hall from the garage to the kitchen area of their residence, and Rose Hughes heard someone at their front, west-side door. Mrs. Hughes answered the door, and found suspects 1 & 2 outside. They asked if they could use the telephone, and when Mrs. Hughes asked what for, they said their car was broke down, around the corner. Mrs. Hughes said," Let me get my husband," and James Hughes, hearing what was going on came into the living room area, just inside the front, west-side door. The subjects entered the residence, and asked for a phone book. Mrs. Hughes gave the phone book to suspect #1, who was standing by the phone in the living room. He picked up the phone and dialed a number, and then said he couldn't get anyone. He said to Mr. Hughes that he thought his transmission had gone out, and asked if Mr. Hughes knew anybody that fixes transmissions. Mr. Hughes said he didn't know if it was a transmission problem, but said he would call his son, James Hughes Jr., who had a tow truck. He then tried to call his son but could get no answer. Within a few minutes, Mr. Hughes said he would call his boy again, and suspect # 1 asked him if his boy was coming down. He then pulled out what Mr. Hughes describes as a single barreled, sawed-off shotgun, pointed it at Mr. Hughes, and told him, " I'll blow your fucking brains out!" Suspect # 2 was sitting in a chair in the living room at this point, reading a paper, and had not yet shown a gun. Suspect # 1 told Mr. Hughe to give him his wallet or he would blow him away. Mr. Hughes then handed #1 his black leather wallet.containing approx. \$ 200.00 in cash, and personal papers. Suspect 1 asked Mr. Hughes, "Is this all you've got. If you're lying I'm gonna kill you. Give me that ring! "Suspect 1 then jerked the ring from Mr. Hughes's finger (1.75 carat diamond, yellow gold mount). Suspect 1 then demanded a second ring from Mr. Hughes, but he said that it was his wedding band, and suspect 1 said, "OK, then keep it."

Suspect 1 then approached Mrs. Hughes, and said, "Where's your purse?"

Mrs. Hughes told him that she did not have one, but suspect 1 found it in the dining room. He then took an envelope with \$ 175.00 cash from it, and told Mrs. Hughes, "You lied. I ought to blow your fucking brains out! " Suspect 1 then told suspect 2 to put his gun on the victims, and suspect 2 produced a long barreled pistol, probably blue in color, and held the victims in the living room. Suspect 1 then went into the master bedroom, came back out, and asked where their jewelry box was. He then tore some drawers out of a small jewelry valet, and took a loaded .25 cal.,9 shot, blued pistol from a small table top beside the bed in the master bedroom. Suspect 1 then reentered the living room, and told the victims to get into the bedroom, which they did. At one point, suspect 1 opened a sliding door to the main closet in the bedroom, and told the victims to get into the closet, but Mr. Hughes protested and suspect 1 relented his demand. Suspect 1 again threatened that he ought to kill the victims, and said when I go out, I don't want to hear a fucking word. If you come out, you're dead. He then slammed the bedroom door, and victims heard some ransacking in the living room. The victims stayed inside the bedroom, for some time, until they were sure that suspects had left, or gone in the basement. They then ran outside, Mrs. Hughes going to a neighbor's house and Mr. Hughes going across the street where a baseball practice was being held. They then met back at their house, and called HQ.

Mr. Leonard Epp, of 2450 Belleflower, Alliance (823-2655) had been at the ball practice with his son, Edward Epp, age 9. Mr. Epp could not give detailed descriptions, but said that he had seen 3 white males, in their teens, 1 of whom was dressed in a gray sweatshirt, with a green collar sticking out underneath, and a green hat, running NE from the victim's residence, carrying something silver, like a stereo amplifier. Capt. Everett was contacted by Sharon Peterson, age 30, 517 W. Oxford, Alliance 823-1542, who had found the victim's wallet beside the apartment complex in the 1100 block of W. Cambridge. The wallet was missing the money, but personal papers were still in it. The wallet was turned over to Capt. Everett, and was then left at the residence to be processed with other items for latent fingerprints by Dets. Warner and Mucklo. Two phones had been disconnected at the residence by suspects, and were laying on the floor, and the phone book and other items of possible value for latent prints were pointed out to detectives on their arrival, for photograhing and processing, and they then continued the investigation.
