MR. NORRIS WAS TALKING TO MR. ST. CLAIR ABOUT AN INTERVIEW HE DID WITH TWO INVESTIGATORS SOMETIME IN APRIL. APPARENTLY, TWO INVESTIGATORS WHO ARE WORKING FOR TYRONE NOLING'S ATTORNEYS ASKED MR. ST. CLAIR SOME QUESTIONS ABOUT THE HARTIG MURDERS. MR. ST. CLAIR WENT ON TO TELL THESE TWO INVESTIGATORS THAT HE DOES NOT KNOW WHAT ~~WAS~~ HAPPENED AT THE HARTIG'S RESIDENCE BECAUSE HE WAS NOT THERE. THE INVESTIGATORS TOLD MR. ST. CLAIR THAT THEY COULD HOLD HIM ~~OUT~~ ^{GETTING A NEW ATTORNEY} IN ~~AN APPEAL~~ ^{AN APPEAL} AND IN AN APPEAL WHEN THE TIME COMES. IF HE SAYS HE WAS NOT AT THE HARTIG'S RESIDENCE. MR. MACKEY HAD TWO TRANSCRIPTS OF INTERVIEWS SITTING ON THE TABLE IN FRONT OF MR. ST. CLAIR. ONE TRANSCRIPT WAS OF AN INTERVIEW MR. ST. NORRIS ASKED HIM IF THAT ONE WAS THE ~~CORRECT~~ TRANSCRIPT ~~THAT~~ THAT WAS CORRECT AS TO WHAT HAPPENED AT THE HARTIG'S RESIDENCE. MR. ST. CLAIR SAID IT WAS. MR. NORRIS ASKED WHY MR. ST. CLAIR CHANGED HIS STORY AND MR. ST. CLAIR REPLIED HE DID NOT KNOW. MR. NORRIS THEN SAID HE COULD SENTENCE MR. ST. CLAIR TO THE MAXIMUM AND MAKE HIM AN EXAMPLE ~~FOR~~ TO THE PUBLIC THAT THE PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE DOES NOT FUCK AROUND. MR. ST. CLAIR SAID HE DID REALIZE THAT.

MR. MACKEY TOLD MR. ST. CLAIR THAT MR. NORRIS WAS RIGHT IN THAT MR. ST. CLAIR
DID NOT RECEIVE A SENTENCE FROM THE STATE AS OF YET. ^{MR. MACKEY} ~~HE~~ AGREED WITH
MR. NORRIS IN THAT GARY ST. CLAIR COULD RECEIVE THE MAXIMUM SENTENCE.
